



Welcome to CPU Intermediate School

CPU Intermediate, located at 202 West Main Street in Urbana, Iowa, is one of four buildings in the Center Point-Urbana Community School District. The building houses classrooms for 3rd, 4th, and 5th-grade students as well as preschool for three year olds in the morning and four year olds in the afternoon. It is also home of the CPU District Office. Center Point and Urbana are growing communities along the Interstate 380 corridor between Waterloo and Iowa City.

Over thirty dedicated staff members work at the Center Point-Urbana Intermediate School. Teachers are committed to continued learning and to doing what is best for students. They work very hard to make sure every student's needs are met to help them grow as much as possible each school year. There are fifteen third through fifth-grade homerooms in the Intermediate building. Four special education teachers assist students who qualify for an IEP by co-teaching in general education classrooms and/or pulling out students to meet their individual needs. In addition to a full-time counselor, we have a full-time nurse and a media specialist who is shared with the Primary building. When they are not in the building, a health secretary and a media paraprofessional are available to assist students. All Intermediate students attend PE, Art, Music, SOAR (Guidance), and Media class every five days. Band and choir classes are available on alternate days for fifth-grade students. A TAG (talented and gifted) teacher works with our staff and students in the mornings. Each of the four buildings in the district has a full release instructional coach who supports teachers and students. A fifth instructional coach supports special education teachers in the district and a sixth focuses on K-8 data and interventions.

Goals

- Student Achievement – To improve the percent of students who are proficient on FAST in math and reading by five percent (80% -> 85% proficient) & to improve the percent of 5th grade students who are proficient on FAST in math and reading to 80%.
- SEBH – To improve the “Adult-Student Relationship” percentage of students at each grade level to 85% or higher as measured by the Conditions for Learning.
- COMMUNICATION – By the end of the 2022-23 school year, 80% of CPU Intermediate families will rate their level of satisfaction with communication from teachers and the intermediate principal to be very good or higher as measured by a survey from the intermediate office.
