

NOTICE: CONGRESS ENDS FREE MEALS FOR ALL STUDENTS THIS SCHOOL YEAR

When the 2021-2022 school year ends, so do free meals for every student. While the federal government funded a program that allowed all students access to free meals during the COVID-19 pandemic, Congress recently declined to continue funding this program. This means all families will need to carry a positive balance in their children's school meal accounts when school begins next fall.

We understand this change may cause concern. There are important steps you can take to make sure your student receives the meals they need next year.

1. Complete an Application for Free and Reduced Meals >> DO NOW! <<

If your student qualifies for free or reduced meals, they can still receive them next year, but you must take action to make it happen.

a. <u>Complete the 2021-2022 Free And Reduced Meal Application</u> <<CLICK LINK) before the end of this school year if you have not already filled out an application for the 2021-2022 school year.

This will give you a 30 day grace period at the start of the 2022-2023 school year to complete another application for next year.

b. Then, fill out the 2022-2023 online application which will be available on the District's website after August 1, 2022. Even if you complete the 2021-2022 application, you will still need to complete the 2022-2023 application as well.

<u>2. Budget for the Cost of School Lunches</u> (if you do not qualify for free and reduced meals). Families that do not qualify for free or reduced meals can start depositing money into their student dining account to prepare for the cost of school lunches next year. Information on meal prices for the 2022-2023 school year will be available in the near future.

3. Pay off Negative School Lunch Balances.

If your student has a negative lunch balance, we encourage you to pay that as soon as possible and then begin depositing money into your student's account to prepare for the 2022-2023 school year.

LEVEL INFORMATION:

Level I - Introduction to Water Skills - Purpose: Help students feel comfortable in the water. Skills: Basic water safety rules, using a life jacket, submerging mouth, nose and eyes, opening eyes underwater and picking up submerging object, swimming on front and back using arm and leg actions, recognizing a swimmer in distress and getting help, exhaling underwater and floating on front and back.

Level II - Fundamental Aquatic Skills - Purpose: Give students success with fundamental skills. Skills: Moving in the water while wearing a life jacket, submerging entire head, front and back glide, treading water using arm and leg motions, recognizing a swimmer in distress and getting help, bobbing in water, jellyfish float and swimming using combined stroke on front and back.

Level III - Stroke Development - Purpose: Build on the skills in Level 2 by providing additional guided practice. Skills: Reaching assist, submerging and retrieving an object, front and back glide, front and back crawl, kneeling or standing dive (shallow dive progression), rotary breathing in horizontal position, survival float, back float, butterfly-kick and body motion

Level IV - Stroke Improvement - Purpose: Develop confidence in the stroke learned and improve other aquatic skills. Skills: Safe diving rules, dive from stride position or shallow dive, survival float, back float, elementary backstroke, breaststroke, butterfly, throwing assist, feet-first dive and front and back crawl.

Level V - Stroke Refinement - Purpose: Provide further coordination and refinement of strokes. Skills: Survival swimming, standing dive (diving progression), open turns on front and back, front and back crawl, performing rescue breathing, tuck surface dive and pike surface dive, front flip turn and backstroke flip turn, elementary backstroke, butterfly, breaststroke and sidestroke.

Level VI - Swimming and Skill Proficiency - Purpose: Refine strokes so students swim with ease, efficiency, power and smoothness over greater distances. Level 6 is designed to focus on preparing students to participate in more advanced courses, such as Lifeguard Training.

Start registering for swim lessons on Monday, April 11 at vprdzone.com.

First, create an account for yourself. Next, add family members to your account. Lastly, register for Red Cross Group Swim Lessons for your family members!

2022-23 IMPORTANT INFORMATION

SENIORS 2022-23

It is required that all seniors have a copy of proof for the Meningococcal (ACWY) vaccine for Meningitis at age 16 or older before starting their senior year. If you already have a copy of this please forward it to klint@cpuschools.org or fax it to 319-849-2068 or drop it off to the high school office. If it has not been completed, please put it on your schedule to get it completed.

FRESHMEN 2022-23

It is required that all incoming freshmen have a dental screen prior to entering 9th grade. If your child has already had their dental visit this year you may go ahead and send the form to klint@cpuschools.org or fax it to 319849-2068 or drop it off at the high school office. Your dental office will have a copy of the form. It is titled Iowa Department of Public Health Certificate of Dental Screening.

7th GRADERS 2022-23

It is required that all incoming 7th graders have a copy of a Meningococcal (for Meningitis) and a Tdap (Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis) vaccine before starting 7th grade. If you already have a copy of this please forward it to klint@cpuschools.org or fax it to 319-849-1758 or drop it off at the middle school office. If it has not been completed please put it on your schedule to get it completed.

3rd GRADERS 2022-23

It is required that all incoming 3rd graders have a vision screening, valid from one year prior to the start of 3rd grade until the beginning of the school year. Forms are available on the CPU website under health services > health requirements by grade. If you already have a copy of this please send to edelarm@cpuschools.org or fax it to 319-443-2764 or drop it off at the intermediate office. If it has not been completed please get it on your schedule to get it completed this summer.

KINDERGARTENERS 2022-23

It is required that all incoming Kindergarteners have up to date immunizations, a lead screening, dental screening, and vision screening for the upcoming school year.
