- Use of the Safe+Sound School Violence Reporting Tool [See Attachment]
- Maintain secured entrances during the school day
- Forthcoming installation of security cameras and illuminated lighting thanks to a \$200,000 Safety Grant
- Implementation of new K-12 Social Emotional Learning (SEL) curriculum

A safe, secure, and caring learning environment, along with a dedicated staff, helps maximize student's learning which, again, is the focus of our mission. How well do our students do? Attached are the Iowa School Performance Profiles for our district since 2018. These profiles—along with each year's overall rating—demonstrates how our schools are performing on required measures. While continuous improvement is always the goal, CPU students and schools are performing well overall (as evident by a lot of greens and golds)!

Introducing Our School Violence Reporting Tool



Dear Parents and Families:

As part of the Center Point-Urbana CSD's commitment to our students' safety and mental health, we are pleased to introduce **Safe+Sound Iowa**—a free, anonymous school violence reporting tool. Starting this 2023-24 school year, students, parents, teachers and other community members can help identify and provide intervention for students in crisis before they harm themselves or others.

Safe+Sound Iowa is available to K–12 schools statewide at no charge by the Governor's School Safety Bureau. It was developed to help prevent violence, unlawful possession of weapons, self-harm and other forms of victimization and threatening behaviors. Similar programs have been successful in preventing tragedy and saving lives in schools across the country, including Colorado, Pennsylvania and Arizona.

HOW SAFE+SOUND IOWA WORKS

In past school attacks in the United States, 92% of those who noticed concerning behaviors before the events were schoolmates.* Students may not report warning signs due to feelings of anxiety or intimidation, fear of retaliation or not knowing who to talk to. Safe+Sound Iowa removes these barriers with easy, convenient and confidential ways to report safety concerns.

Reports can be made securely and anonymously in a variety of ways:

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Trained dispatchers monitor reports 24/7 and immediately engage in two-way communication with those raising concerns. They then reach out to the appropriate local school safety contact, law enforcement or other community partners.
