Dear CPU Parents, Staff, and Community Members:

The weather has certainly done a number on us since we returned from Winter Break; not only did we just complete our first full week of school since 2023, we held classes on a Tuesday for the first time in 6 weeks! This edition of my newsletter has a focus of "**Planning and Progress**" so I'll just get right to it!

School Safety (District Goal 2: Safe & Caring Environment)

- In lieu of recent events in Iowa including the tragedy in Perry and the "swatting" incidents across the the state (that also affected CPU), in the never-ending endeavor to stay proactive, the district is working with **Linn County Sheriff's Office** for their **Emergency Response Plan**
- To keep parents informed of our efforts to ensure a safe and caring environment, **Linn County law enforcement agents** will soon be visiting the high, middle, and primary schools **to simply review and update** their Emergency Response Plans with our schools
- For the Intermediate school, last summer I also met with Urbana Chief of Police, Chief Baker; the district has also had similar ongoing conversations with him along with reaching out to Benton County Emergency Management

24-25 Academic Calendar (District Goal 1: Student Achievement)

- The 24-25 Calendar Survey had <u>482</u> total results (+128 from last year); thank you all who took the time to take the survey
 - 70% were parents, 18% were teachers, the rest were support staff, students, community, business, and administrators
 The ratings were 1 = Dissatisfied and 4 = Highly Satisfied
 - 90% gave a rating of "3" or "4" for being satisfied with current calendar
 - **56%** preferred Wed. Late Start PD while 44% chose an Early Out option
 - 61% prefer 12 days for Winter Break while 39% selected 13 total days
- The district's Calendar Committee met last night to review and discuss the survey results; the next step is to create a draft with the goal of presenting it to the School Board on 2/19/24

Primary Playground Progress (District Goal 4: Finances & Facilities)

- Since last fall, the district, in collaboration with the PTO, has made great progress with the potential to get the Primary school a new playground.
- **Big shout out** to the **PTO** and especially **Heidi Goettsch** and **Jennifer Dunn** for leading the charge to help fundraise for this endeavor
- In October, the CPU School Board approved the recommendation to engage with an engineer and to have a survey done for the project.
- At the January School Board meeting, the School Board approved the recommendation to seek bids for this project
- Bids will be received on March 7th, 2024

Master Facilities Plan (District Goal 4: Finances & Facilities)

- On January 11, 2024, there was a School Board Work Session with INVISION Architecture to review, discuss, and plan for CPU's Master Facilities Plan; the bulk of this plan originally occurred during the 2021-22 school year
- The first (of two) **Community Task Force** meetings, consisting of stakeholders that were previously on the committee, just occurred this past week; the next meeting is planned in early March
- In April the plan is to engage with the entire community to gain insight, feedback, etc. on the future of CPU's facilities

While these are just some, not all, of the important areas the district is making strides on, I cannot be any more sincere when I say thank you for all of your support for our students, staff, and schools.
