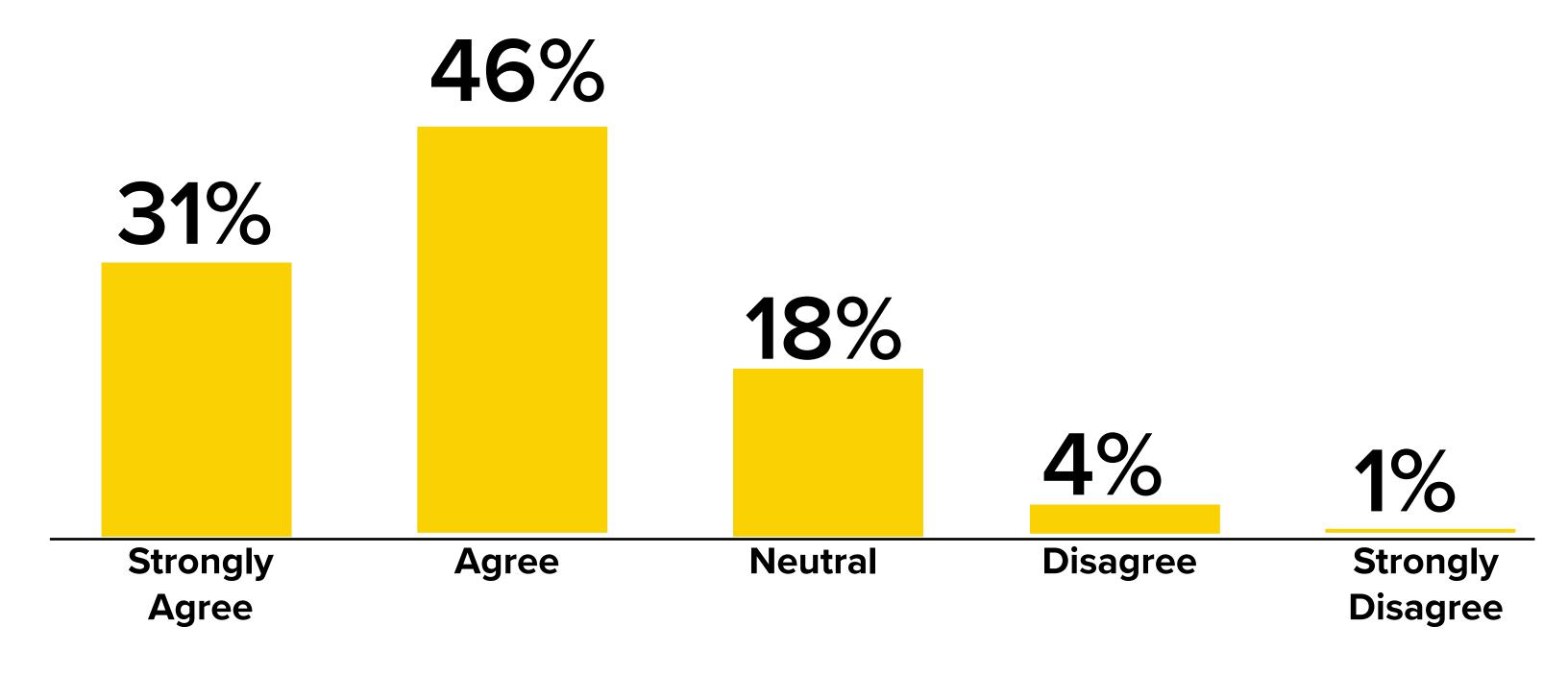

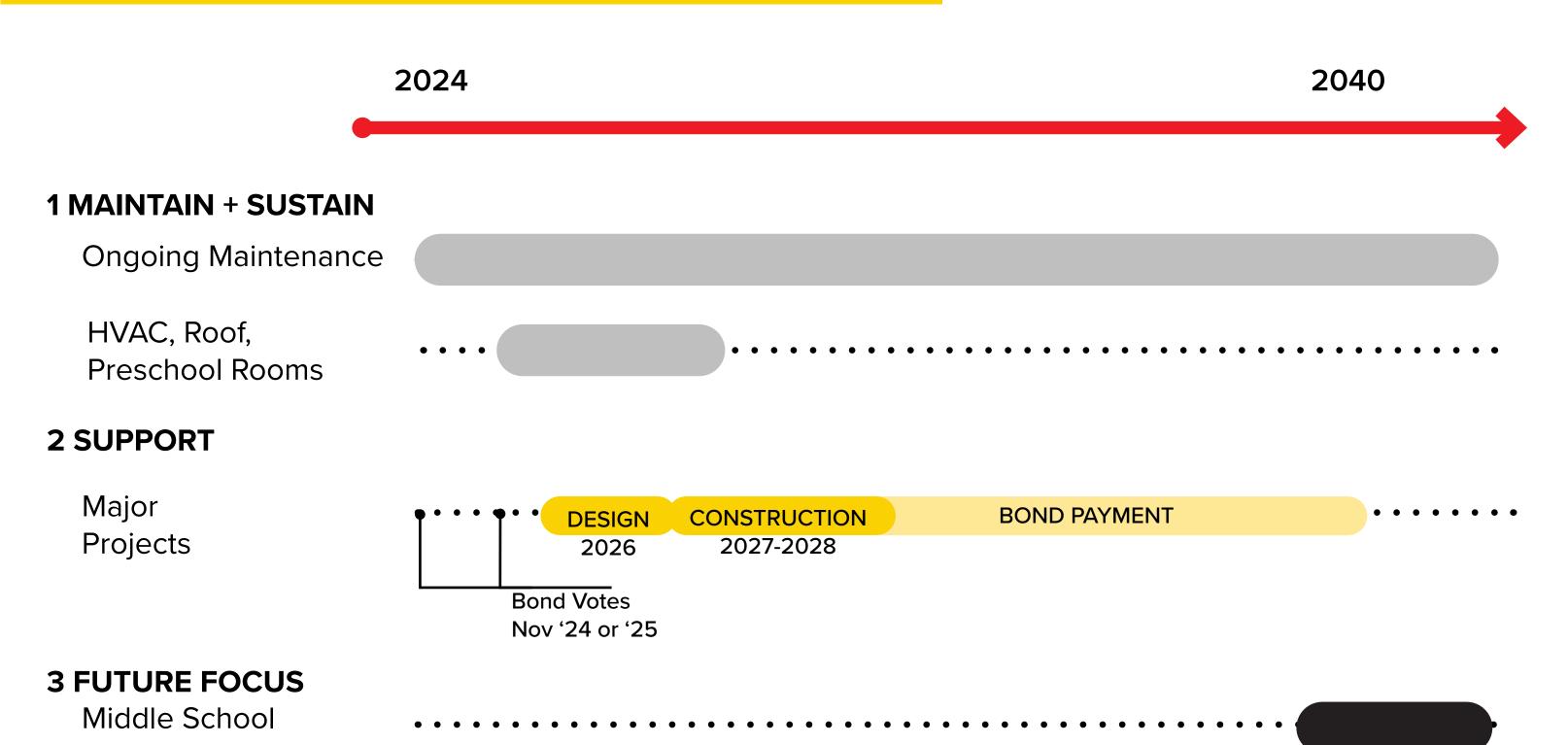

CHANGES

House File 2652 was signed by the governor. This says that no bond can be issued for buildings or sites used primarily for athletic competition or contest until all the district's attendance centers are in compliance with provisions of the state building code incorporating standards to increase the safety of school safety and infrastructure. There are currently no provisions regarding school safety. A task force will provide recommendations to the state by December 31st on what the building code should adopt.

Timeline for getting a petition on the ballot has moved up. Now you must have your project scope and dollar amount defined by your July school board meeting based on federal ruling (Previously August).
