Dear CPU Families and Community Members:

On Tuesday, voters in the Center Point-Urbana Community School District will head to the polls for the 2024 presidential election and to consider a local bond referendum that would support investments across our four schools.

Major Voting and Bond Information:

- Polls will be open on election day from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. You can find your polling place on the Iowa Secretary
 of State's website at https://sos.iowa.gov/elections.
- The CPU bond referendum will appear on local ballots as " Public Measure NE." It will be located on the back of the ballot in the lower right-hand column.
- This bond referendum requires a voter approval of at least 60% to pass. If the CPU measure reaches that threshold, the district would leverage up to \$20.615 million in general obligation funds for a multiphase expansion and improvement plan including:
 - A new 600-seat auditorium, a new weight room, and a multipurpose space at the high school.
 - Improvements for the baseball and softball fields, along with upgrades to the concessions.
 - To prioritize student safety, these funds will also be used to secure entry sequences at the Primary and Middle schools, ensuring that all visitors pass through a single monitored entrance.
 - CPU's debt levy rate would <u>not</u> increase if the bond measure is approved on election day. Property taxpayers would continue to pay the same rate they have been accustomed to in recent years: \$4.05 per every \$1,000 of taxable property value.
