- Showing off our new bus while spotlighting the INAUGURAL Middle School Girls and Boys Soccer Teams



Health & Nursing Services Department

Primary & Intermediate:

- 7,800+ office visits this school year & 6,400+ medication passes
- Navigated care for 20+ students with broken bones :(
- The Primary SEBH committee welcomed Nurse Gracie to the team to help bridge the gap for students with social/emotional needs.
- All PK-5th classrooms received a health lesson ranging all the way from handwashing to the dangers of drugs/alcohol. Students were eager to learn!

Middle & High School:

- Approximately 6500 student office visits
- Approximately 5000 prescription medicine passes
- 442 health conditions
- Filed for \$57,792 in Medicaid reimbursement
- Tracking all student immunizations
- Daily education on healthy habits including diet, exercise, sleep, hydration, hygiene mental health. Education on the effects of drugs, alcohol, smoking, vaping and energy drinks. Also, just a few.... pep talks for going back to class!

Districtwide:


- Stop the Bleed Kits were obtained hung at the end of each hallway in every building. Thank you to custodial & maintenance staff for your help with this!

LEADING WITH VISION THE PLC JOURNEY OF CENTER-POINT URBANA SCI

In 2021, Center Point-Urbana Community School District (CPU CSD) embarked on a transformative journey to establish a Professional Learning Community (PLC) from the ground up. The district leadership sought an instructional framework that would best serve students, exploring various models before recognizing the power of PLCs. With a clear vision, CPU set out on a path to implement and sustain a culture of collaboration, continuous improvement, and student success.

To ensure a strong foundation, district leaders first engaged in a collective study of Revisiting Professional Learning Communities at Work. This provided a fundamental understanding of PLCs and their alignment with the district's mission to develop successful, lifelong learners. To further solidify the vision, all instructional coaches attended an RTI Institute, building their capacity and reinforcing the importance of continuous improvement. By the end of the 2021-22 school year, leaders presented an overview of the forthcoming work, and in the 2022-23 school year, CPU officially began its PLC journey.

Leadership played a crucial role in both the implementation and sustainability of the PLC framework. Since the summer of 2022, nearly 70% of the district's staff—including administrators, instructional coaches, and teachers—have attended Solution Tree institutes. These learning experiences generated momentum, akin to Jim Collins' Turning the Flywheel. Furthermore, the unwavering support from the School Board allowed for additional investments, including onsite embedded coaching. This level of commitment has been instrumental in sustaining CPU's progress.

A key aspect of CPU's PLC success was fostering effective team dynamics. Leaders prioritized capacity-building by developing a centralized Instructional Center via Google, housing essential PLC materials such as team norms, agendas, unit plans, and assessments. The district also implemented an annual Collaborative Culture Populity Assessment a 20 question support
